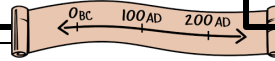
Science

Geography

In geography we will ask the Big Question: What is a mountain and how are they formed. We will look at the different parts of a mountain and study the Himalayas in India.



Music

In music we will listen to the music hall and create our own piece.



Art/DT

In art we will make Rangoli patterns, improve our sketching skills. We will also create some digital art.



Languages

We will be looking at words to do with the café and holding short conversations.



Computing

In computing we will create a podcast about a hobby.



PE

In PE we will be doing striking and fielding and placing an emphasis on improved skills and teamwork.



RE

We will ask the Big Questions: What is the key belief of Muslims? How does this affect their life?
