In PSHE we are focusing on 'Being me in my world'. We will set goals, look at our rights and responsibilities and our role in the community and the wider world.



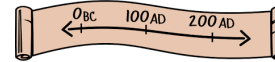
### Science

We are focusing on animals including humans, naming and describing the main parts of the human circulatory system (heart, blood vessels and blood). We will consider the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on our bodies.



### History

In History we will learn about the history of slavery and why it was wrong. We will be looking at changes over the last century.



### Geography

In Geography we will learn about America, its cities and landscape. We will explore the different landmarks.



### Music

In music we will learn about the history of blues music that is associated with slavery and oppression.



### Art/DT

In art we will learn about the artist Ralph McGill and Native American printing.



### Languages

We will be learning key words and how to hold a basic conversation in French.

In computing we will learn about safety and look at how to keep safe online.
