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What's going on in Derby?

DerbySAL is our new support service specifically for SENCOs in the City.

Whether you want support with individual cases or overall school / setting issues; they are here to help!

They offer informal consultations to SENCOs and Inclusion leads to help you to reflect on the needs and strengths of the child / young person, identify the provisions already in place, support SENCOs to build robust and manageable plans and help you to access the most appropriate services and provisions available.

- Help for SENCOs with the implementation of the Graduated Response.
- Advice regarding all areas of Inclusion and SEND.
- Signposting to local and national services.
- Support for SENCOs with EHCP Panel outcomes and recommendations.

What is SENDIASS?

SENDIASS stands for Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Information Advice and Support Services. We are a free, impartial, and confidential service. We can offer independent information, advice, and support to:

- a parent or carer for a child or young person up to age 25 with special educational needs or disabilities
- a child up to age 16 who has special educational needs or disabilities
- a young person aged 16-25 who has special educational needs or disabilities

How can SENDIASS Help?

We can offer you advice and information on key issues like Special Educational Needs and support that may be required in the educational setting. We can also offer support on Education, Health and Care Needs Assessments and Plans and matters relating to social care and health. We can also give you practical support with tasks such as:

- Understanding complicated documents and reports
- Completing paperwork
- Attending meetings with you to ensure your views are heard

Addressing the demand for Neuro Development (ND) Assessments

Neuro Development includes Autism and ADHD.

We are looking at how we can help schools and families to support children and young people with these needs. Parents and professionals have told us that the assessment pathway is being used to try to get help when support needs to be at the right time and in the right place to work.

Across Derby City and Derbyshire County we have come together to form a series of workshops with a vision that: We will have an easily accessible and wide-ranging quality pathway in place that effectively supports CYP with ND needs, their families, and carers, within their local communities where possible, towards the goal of living independently and thriving as children and adults

We have lots of projects already being launched and developed to support children, their families and schools which includes:

Supporting children to access school

Our Sustained Absence Project is working up targeted plans to help children back into education and supported on their return.

In School support for children who are autistic and their families with a focus on transitions especially between primary and secondary education.

SEND Navigators – supporting parents and carers in Derby

Parent carers together (PCT) is the official parent and carer forum for Derby. They've secured funding from Derby City Council to roll out an extended offer of support for parents and carers of children and young people with SEND.

The SEND navigator service delivers support, advice, signposting and a weekly menu of events for parents and carers. They are also developing lots of great resources to help parents and schools to deliver better outcomes for children and young people with SEND in the City.

Where to go next for the right help and support. What are the challenges in your life? Work it through together with experts by experience.

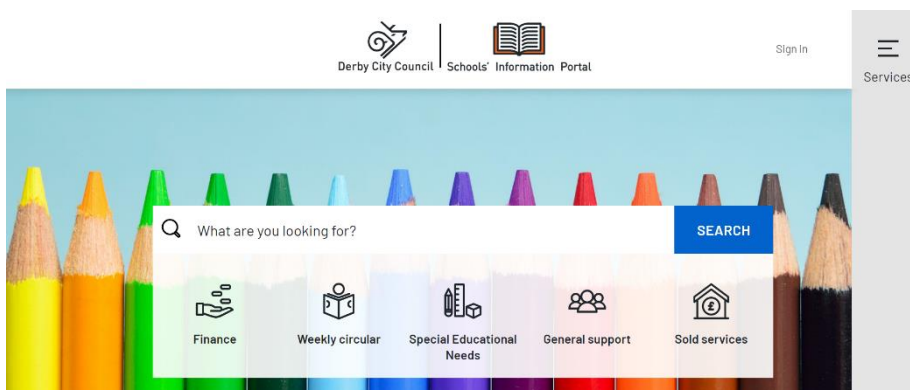

Derby Local Area SEND Written Statement of Action Re-visit



Derby's services for children and young people with special educational needs and/or disabilities were last inspected in June 2019. The inspection found five areas of significant weakness across the local area, and as a result, a [Written Statement of Action](#) was published at the end of 2019. Since then, we have undertaken significant work with partners and other stakeholders to make improvements.

To evaluate whether sufficient progress has been made in each of the five identified areas, inspectors from Ofsted and the Care Quality Commission (CQC) will be hosting a three-day re-visit from Monday 4 to Wednesday 6 October.

How can local children, young people, parents, and carers contribute their views during this local area re-visit?

There are several ways in which children, young people, parents and carers from your provision can engage with the re-visit process and contribute their views. The inspectors will gather the contributions of parents and families through an online survey and a face-to-face open meeting.

The focus of the online survey and open meeting will be set by the inspectors and will be based on the Written Statement. Parents and carers who would like to take part in this survey can follow this internet link: <https://www.smartsurvey.co.uk/s/DerbyRe-VisitLASEND/>

The survey will open at 12 noon on Monday, 27 September 2021 and close at 12 noon on Friday 1 October 2021. Parents and carers can submit their contributions via the online survey using the link provided above or by using the QR code here:



While we recognise that many parents and carers may have views on their experience that extend beyond the focus of the WSOA, we would like parents and carers to understand that the focus of the inspectors during the re-visit will only be the serious weaknesses identified at the previous inspection.

The re-visit team will consider how well leaders have addressed each of the areas of serious weaknesses detailed in the WSOA. We will not be able to follow up or comment upon individual cases.

UPDATE | Transforming our High Needs systems

We are going into the second phase of our High Needs Transformation Programme, supported by Impower, to ensure that families, settings, and schools are confident about our local offer for those with SEND and to strengthen the graduated approach in health, education, and social care to help every child or young person to succeed in life.

The first phase of this work started back in the spring and focussed on understanding the current challenges in the system and implementing new tools and services to support schools. This included the introduction of DerbySAL to support SENCOs and other pilot projects. We also carried out a survey of parents, carers, and professionals to get a clear view of what it is like to support children with SEND in the city.

The second phase of this work will focus on developing some key areas of how we can make SEND services work better for everyone involved based on this feedback. We will be specifically focussing on developing a much stronger early intervention approach to support children and young people, improving our panel processes, and developing an inclusive ambition across the local area.

There will be lots of opportunities to get involved in this work so please keep an eye on the local offer!
