 'Covid Catch Up Premium' statement 2020-21



The government announced £1 billion of funding to support children and young people to catch up lost time after school closure. This is especially important for the most vulnerable and disadvantaged backgrounds. Pear Tree Community Junior School will use this funding for specific activities to support our pupils to 'catch up' for lost teaching over the previous months.

Strategy Statement

To ensure maximum impact, 'Covid catch up Premium' will sit at the heart of a whole school effort, with all staff understanding the strategy and their role within it. At Pear Tree we have implemented a tiered approach to help focus on a small number of strategies that are likely to make the biggest difference:

- Improving teaching (QFT)
- Targeted academic support
- Wider Strategies

Implementation	Costings £	Actions/Strategies	Impact Review
Teaching	£24,000	An additional Teacher will be employed from January 2021 to support Quality First Teaching and provide small group tuition for identified pupils across the school (initial focus on Year 6)	
Targeted academic support	£2200	The National Tutoring Programme 12 hours a week for 15 weeks (up to 36 Pupils (10%) will be identified and receive this targeted support	
Wider strategies	£2000	Learning Mentor support will increase (two additional days per week). This additional time will be used to support targeted pupils and ensure successful integration back into school. Additional Wellbeing Support will be targeted at the most vulnerable pupils
